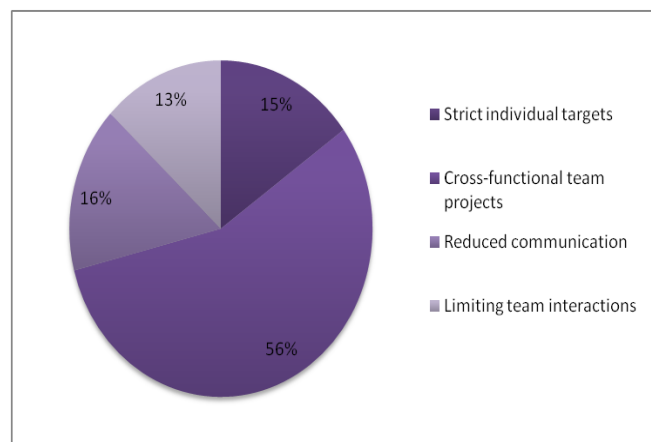
Work management platform

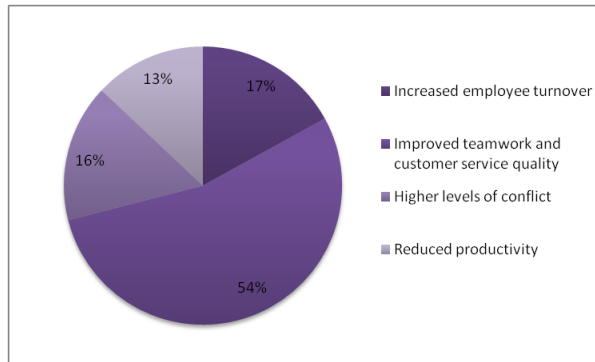
4. DATA ANALYSIS AND INTERPRETATION

1. Which HR procedure at South Indian Bank enables the most effective cross-branch collaboration?



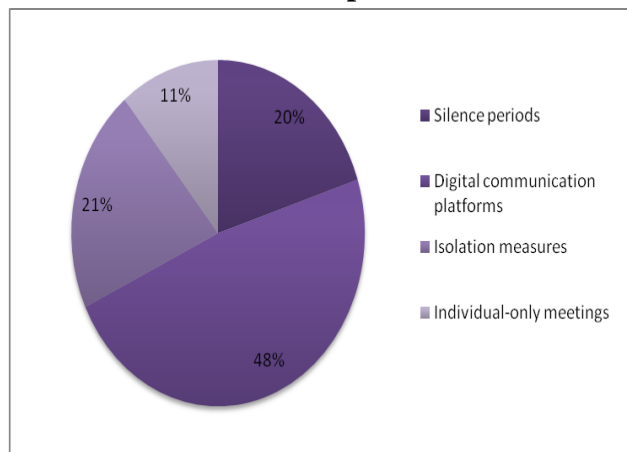
